

THE MEDHOSPITAL FOUNDATION

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I OFFICES

Section 1. Offices. The main office of The Medhospital Foundation (the "Foundation") is in Troy, State of Michigan. The Foundation may have an office or offices at any other place, anywhere in the world as the executive committee may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE II PURPOSES

Section 2. Purposes. The purpose of this organization are as stated in the Articles of Incorporation, including but not limited to the following specific purposes:

- A. To do research on the information available in health related field and provide all such related information in the simplest language possible.
- B. To provide model information structure that ensures easy and simple access to reliable health information.
- C. The information must be presented in different age group formats so as to allow the participation of all age groups.
- D. To create a platform for all health professionals and educationists to collaborate and develop better awareness strategies and execute them in collaboration with medical and health policy makers.

ARTICLE III THE MEMBERS

Section 3. Definition. This Foundation is run by its members. Everyone involved with the foundation's decision-making and its direction constitutes its members. The name of the members have to be declared in the Foundations 'Leadership' section and no individual other than mentioned in the list have the rights of claiming membership.

Section 4. Number. There is no limit to the number of members who can be involved with the Foundation.

Section 5. Appointment, Term of office, and Qualifications. The Founder is the only member who is not elected. The existing members elect all new members by vote of a majority, each of whom shall hold responsibility for such period, have such powers and perform such duties as may be provided by these Bylaws or as the majority of the members may determine.

Section 6. Resignation. Any member may resign by giving a written notice to the other members, or the Founder. Such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein and acceptance shall not be necessary to make it effective.

Section 7. Removal. The rest of the members may also remove any member enrolled in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 by a vote of majority.

Section 8. General Powers. The Foundation members will manage its affairs. Every member shall to the extent not otherwise determined by majority of the members or provided in these Bylaws determine its own rules, and shall submit a report of the actions, if any, which a member may have taken, which actions shall be subject to revision or alteration by the other members, provided however, that no rights of third parties shall be effected adversely by any such revision or alteration.

Section 9. Meetings. This Foundation is a web-based foundation and in keeping with it, will have all its meetings through web-based conferencing. Any participation in such a meeting shall constitute presence in person at such a meeting.

Section 10. Quorum and voting. Any member participating in such a meeting will constitute a quorum for the decision to be taken, except otherwise provided by law or these Bylaws. Each member at a meeting is entitled to one vote and no proxies may be exercised at such a meeting.

Section 11. Non-compensation. No member of the Foundation shall receive compensation for services rendered.

ARTICLE IV MISCELLANEOUS

Section 12. Contracts etc. How executed. Members, except as may be provided in these Bylaws, may authorize any member or members, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any contract or other instruments in the name or in behalf of the Foundation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances. Unless authorized so to do by these Bylaws, no member shall have the power or authority to bind the Foundation by any contract or engagement, or to pledge its credit, or to render liable pecuniarily for any purpose or in any amount.

Section 13. Financial reporting. This Foundation does not fund nor raise funds for it's functioning. The entire expenditure incurred by the Foundation is entirely supported by its Founder. The Foundation does not claim any tax relief for such expenditures or for its assets at the moment. Thus the Foundation has no obligations to publish its financial standing whatsoever.

Section 14. Gender etc. All masculine pronouns and any variations thereof shall be deemed to refer to the masculine, feminine or singular or plural as the identity of the person(s) may require.

ARTICLE V NOTICES

Section 15. Notices. Any Foundation member may give a notice at any time by means of e-mail or letter. Such communications must be addressed to all the rest of the members. Personal communications may be addressed to the Founder alone, who or the member designated by him will be filing the notice with the Foundation records.

Section 16. Complains. All personal complains must be addressed to the Founder. The Founder may decide to forward such complains to other members. The Founder is the only one authorized to ignore or reject a complaint although it's filing with the records of the Foundation is a must.

ARTICLE VI AMENDMENTS

Section 17. Amendments. These Bylaws may be altered, amended, or repealed or new Bylaws may be adopted by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the Members. A minimum of 15 days notice is to be given to all members before the laws are amended.
